

## How To Fill Out Your Scorecard

When reading a curling scoreboard, remember to read it like a number line. The middle row of numbers indicates the total score; the numbers on the top/bottom indicate the end in which the points were scored. To find out how many points your team has, read the number above/below the last end played.

Match your scorecard to the scoreboard. Please hand in your card to the stage promptly after your game

- End #1 – Neither team scored, so Blue indicated a blank end by hanging the first end marker below the “Blank”.
  - End #2 – Yellow scored two points, so they hung the second end marker above the score of 2.
  - End #3 – Yellow scored one point, so they hung the third end marker above the score of 3. (since they have now accumulated 3 points).
  - End #4 – Blue scored four points, so they hung the fourth end marker below the score of 4.
  - End #5 – Blue scored one point, so they have now accumulated five points in total and have hung the fifth end marker below the score of 5.
  - End #6 – Yellow scored three points, so they have now accumulated six points in total and have hung the sixth end marker above the score of 6.
  - End #7 – Blue scored one point, so they hung the seventh end marker below the score of 6.
  - End #8 – Yellow scored two points, so they hung the eighth end marker above the score of 8.
  - At the end of eight ends, Yellow has won by a score of 8-6.

- **Put all ends played on the scorecard.**
  - **Simply match your scorecard to your scoreboard.**
